OUR NEW PROJECTS





The Wave Project <u>https://www.waveproject.co.uk/</u> engages young people through surfing and water sports to build self-esteem and positive mental health. We visited their project in Cornwall in April and watching a group of young people from the surf club braving the freezing waters for two hours with great enthusiasm was very inspiring! We were impressed with their model of service delivery, particularly the way young people are able to continue to participate once they have completed their therapy sessions, and with how many of the young people go onto volunteer with the charity. We are delighted to be contributing to their work.

Greatwood <u>https://www.greatwoodcharity.org/</u> runs therapeutic and educational programmes which support the development of wellbeing, mindfulness and inclusion through animal assisted learning, using retired racehorse. The work takes place in an idyllic country setting where young people spend time getting to know and learning how to take care of the animals. 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

The project allows Street Reach to start to become more available to young people by offering a range of drop-in sessions and daytime appointments that complement our existing projects. The Friday Football project is flourishing with numbers returning to pre-Covid levels.
