Ebony Horse Club https://www.ebonyhorseclub.org.uk/ On a crisp sunny day in March we went to Ebony to meet staff and students from The Michael Tippett School and College https://www.tmts.me.uk/index.asp and



observe their weekly session. It was great to see the Ebony staff and volunteers in action and we were so impressed with the support and attention each student received. The young people spent time mucking out, grooming and bonding with the horses and had the chance to ride. Students at Michael Tippett have a range of complex needs and the Ebony team carefully tailored the experience to each individual. School staff shared how much the young people had grown in confidence over the course of their sessions and the enthusiasm and positivity from all who participated was wonderful to see. Thank you to all our supporters who make these lessons possible.

Magdalen Farm https://magdalenfarm.org.uk/ Our partnership with Magdalen Farm continues to develop following the great feedback from everyone who enjoyed a residential break at the farm last Summer. This year, in addition to sponsoring trips for Youth Options, Kids on Track https://kidsontrack.org.uk/ and Street Reach, we are also funding residential stays for two groups of refugees who are being supported by International Care Network https://www.helpandkindness.co.uk/organisations/194/international-care-network, a charity that works with vulnerable refugees and asylum seekers across Dorset and Bournemouth. We are sure everyone will have an amazing time.







The Bourne Academy https://www.thebourneacademy.com is a school in a deprived area of Bournemouth. Hayley Gaj, Sendco & Transition Lead, was also one of Allegra's teachers at St Swithuns and trekked to Base Camp of Mount Everest in support of Allegra's Ambition. She was inspired by visiting and volunteering with Allegra's Ambition to help get the Youth Options outdoor learning centre up and running last year. Bourne wanted to develop a neglected area of the school grounds to provide the opportunity for outdoor learning to their students but also to the wider community of young people living in the area. We have matchfunded with Bourne to enable them to refurbish their outdoor learning area and assault course.

Street Reach https://www.winchesterstreetreach.org/ The Friday Football project is going from strength to strength. Young people attend to enjoy the football and access advice and support from the outreach youth workers - the feedback from Street Reach is very positive.







Carneys https://carneyscommunity.org/ aims to reduce offending, re-offending, and anti-social behaviour, whilst improving social mobility and community cohesion. The services are targeted at disadvantaged young people aged 11-30 from deprived backgrounds in Wandsworth. The work is focused on building self-discipline, self-esteem, confidence, and employability of young people, as this is key to reducing offending. The charity engages around 600 young people each year in positive and constructive activities.

"If I'm here I'm not on the roads. If I had nothing to do, I could possibly be a gang member. It's keeping me preoccupied and being fed as well."

We are proud to be funding an ongoing project at Carney's Community which engages at risk young people through Boxing and other activities, and provides one to one mentoring by a team of workers, a number of whom have come through Carneys programmes themselves. Many of the mentees report having being 'passed between' different agencies (one person had to tell his story to 40 different professionals before accessing support) which can lead to them becoming frustrated and withdrawing from support services. The mentoring Carneys offer is unique and key to rebuilding trust, enabling young people to reach their full potential.
